St Augustine of Canterbury Primary School Sport Premium – Evidencing the Impact 2019-2020

At St Augustine of Canterbury Primary School, we want our pupils, upon leaving primary school, to be **physically literate** and to have the **knowledge**, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a **healthy**, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Our objective, with support from the Sport Premium funding, is to achieve a **self-sustaining** improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools against five key indicators:

- 1. the engagement of <u>all</u> pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- 2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport

So far this academic year St Augustine of Canterbury Primary School has received a total of **£17,790**. This academic year, we predict that we will have spent **£13,358.48** which means that we will have an additional **£4,431** to carry over to next year to ensure that improvements will be sustainable and benefit both current and future pupils.
