





Chaplaincy Newsletter September 2020

We are all adapting to a new way of worship as we return to schools and colleges. Though we will not be able to gather together in large numbers for masses and assemblies our prayers are needed more than ever. I know that chaplains will continue to provide worship and spiritual guidance to the children and young people in our schools. In this newsletter there are some ideas for prayer, reflection and assemblies.

In his prayer intention for September 2020, Pope Francis asks that we learn to respect the planet's resources. He describes the earth as an orange that we are squeezing till all its goodness is gone. Pope Francis encourages us to share the earth's resources in a respectful manner. He describes the industries and countries in the Global North enriching themselves by exploiting the natural resources in the South. Pope Francis reminds us that it is today not tomorrow that we must care for creation responsibly.

Missio is the Pope's charity for world mission. They have ideas for you to support Pope Francis' prayer intention for September.

- Pray Pope Francis' intention every day, but especially on Fridays.
- Maybe you could find a quiet spot outside in a garden or park to pray and reflect.

- Plant spring bulbs this month for new life in your garden next year.

<u>Laudato Si</u>

It is the special anniversary year of Laudato Si which will be celebrated till 24th May 2021. We would like to recognise this important encyclical in our schools and colleges. Pope Francis calls on us to consider how we use the planet's resources so we can transform our relationships and live in harmony with God, nature and one another. I am calling on you to do something special to mark this anniversary. This could be creating a prayer space or garden, planning a special celebration with your parish or becoming a livesimply award community with CAFOD. <u>Covid 19</u>

On 19th August 2020 Pope Francis asked how we can prepare for the future after the global pandemic. In response the Columbans, youth workers and chaplains across the Dioceses of Plymouth, Southwark, Leeds, Northampton, Arundel and Brighton have created a resource called Prepare the Future. It is a twelve-unit resource **aimed at young people aged between 13 and 18.** It includes liturgies and reflections that can be adapted. There are prayers on the CAFOD website <u>https://cafod.org.uk/Pray/Prayer-resources/Coronavirus-prayers</u> that can be used in assemblies, collective worships and daily prayers.

Ten Ten have created 'Assemblies in the Classroom' a resource that will enable schools to continue delivering weekly Gospel-rooted assemblies in classroom and bubble groups, whilst maintaining social distancing measures in school. Collective Worship will need to play an important part in children's spirituality as they access the recovery curriculum. You may also consider using your school chaplains to record assemblies for other children in the school.

Mary

Last year I attended the 'Building the Kingdom' course led by Sister Judith Rossi. She encouraged the teachers and governors who attended the course to use Mary as a starting point to discuss how women influence us in our lives. Mary shaped Jesus' life while he was on earth. She was with him at the beginning of his life and the end. Mary has been a strong influence in the life of Pope Francis who prayed to 'Mary undoer of knots' during his darkest time. I witnessed pupils from Holy Family Primary School who spoke eloquently about how they saw Mary in a new perspective, women who had influenced them and collective worship they took part in after their teacher was inspired by the course. There are many feasts of Mary during September and October you may wish to celebrate:

Tuesday 8th September - Nativity of Mary Tuesday 15th September - Our Lady of Sorrows Thursday 24th September - Our Lady of Walsingham Wednesday 7th October - Our Lady of the Rosary October is the month of the Rosary; chaplains could help to lead Rosary groups. Perhaps you could create prayer stations in school using pictures and titles of Mary. Perhaps you could arrange a socially distanced Marian procession outside.



Year of Communion

Covid 19 affected the way we worshipped and the Year of Communion theme 'Together we are Stronger' wasn't always possible to accomplish this year. I would encourage schools and colleges to consider the following things:

- How well do you work in partnership with other schools?
- Is Catholic Social Teaching embedded in your curriculum?
- How has the People of Hope programme developed in your schools/colleges?



- Do you support global charities?
- How are you developing your parish/school/college links?
