Spellings

I have been very impressed with the progress made with Spellings so far this year. As always, new spellings will be given on Friday and tested the following Friday. Please make sure red spelling books are brought to school on a Friday.

By July, children will be expected to spell all 45 of the Year I Common Exception words. The children are well on their way to achieving this goal.

English

Our text this term is The Three Wolves and the Big Bad Pig by Eugene Trivizas. The children will retell and innovate the story and write a newspaper account. They will be expected to write using a variety of simple and compound sentences as well as a range of punctuation. Lubna & Pebble by Wendy Meddour will be the focus text in Term Six. The children will be taught to edit and improve their written work and practice reading aloud. I am expecting the children to attempt to join up some of their handwriting in the final terms.

Reading

This term we will continue to focus on comprehension skills and Guided Reading. The children need to be able to sequence events in a story and make inferences from the text as well as read with fluency and expression. Reading books will be continued to be changed on a Monday and a Thursday. Please hear your children read their school reading book at least four time per week.



The Year One Phonics Test will take place Wb: 12th June. This will assess whether sufficient progress is being made with phonics skills and to ensure children are on track to become fluent readers who can enjoy reading for pleasure and learning. The Oxford Owl is free to join and has plenty of activities for the children to practice before the test in June.



ICT The Impact of Technology is the unit of work in Term 5. The children will recognise the common uses of technology and identify the dangers in using it. They will learn how technology has changed over time. Programming will be taught in Term 6. Children will create and debug simple programs and write algorithms.	RE In RE over the next two terms, pupils will be taught the units of Easter, Pentecost and Sacraments. The children will identify symbols of Pentecost and recognise the Pentecost story. During the Sacraments unit they will recognise that Jesus asks people to forgive each other and be able to retell the story of the Servant King.
<u>Art/DT</u> In Term 5 the focus will be Art - Sculpture and 3D paper play. The children will use their paper shaping skills to make an imaginative sculpture.
