### Question 7: The school works closely with parents of children with special educational needs (SEN)

Here over ¾ of respondents either did not fall into this category or agreed. However, we have listened to past feedback and worked hard to improve on this. Our SENCO, Mrs Deanne Fitzpatrick, is contactable via phone or email (via the office) and sets aside parents slots alongside parents' evenings for meetings. We are also in our second year of rolling out our 'Edukey' provision mapping software, which has scope for parents to interact in the support process for their child, in partnership with the school. We are also able to support any families who may need it via our parent link worker, Mrs Christine Cranney.

Since the resumption of normal schooling post Covid in 2021, we have created three distinct additional areas in our spare rooms to support all children, including those with special educational needs. We have a nurture room, a sensory room and an ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) room, run by Mrs Hodges.


### Question 8:

In previous feedback you have told us that you would like more clubs and sporting activities. This was much reduced during Covid and we have worked hard to significantly increase the range of sporting and other opportunities on offer. We have 5 professionally run sports clubs (3 Signature Sports clubs, plus Tag Rugby and Cricket), STEM robotics, drama, sewing and now a football team, complete with our own kit. In recent months we have also had chess, Latin, hockey, gardening, chaplaincy and booster clubs; many run by teachers in their own time.

Our P.E. lead, Miss Harvey is very keen to seek opportunities to participate in sports and competitions within our local area, as well as promoting active travel through our 'Modeshift' accreditation. This includes Bikeabilty, Scooter Training, Road Safety Awareness, Travel Tracker and many other initiatives. Children in Years 4-6 swim at Bradley Stoke Leisure Centre.
